Northeast Energy Direct Project -- New Compressor Station Locations

Dear Landowner:

As you may already be aware, Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company, L.L.C. ("Tennessee") is proposing the Northeast Energy Direct Project ("Project") to expand its existing pipeline system to serve the growing demand for interstate natural gas transmission service in the northeastern United States and more specifically, the New England region. The Project involves the installation of approximately 410 miles of new and looped pipeline in Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New Hampshire. To minimize impacts from construction, the proposed pipeline facilities will be co-located for a majority of its length with existing utility corridors where practicable. In addition, the Project includes the modifications and construction of compressor stations and meter stations, including nine new compressor station locations.

The Project is subject to regulation by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") under Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act. On September 15, 2014, Tennessee requested authorization to use the FERC's pre-filing process ("Process") for the Project and the FERC approved Tennessee's request on October 2, 2014 in FERC Docket No. PF14-22-000. Since the opening of the pre-filing Process, Tennessee has filed with the FERC several drafts of environmental resource reports, including information on the proposed locations for Project facilities. In the March 13, 2015 filing of the draft Environmental Report, Tennessee noted that it would be filing updated information with the FERC regarding the locations of the nine new compressor stations proposed for the Project.

Tennessee has recently determined the specific locations for the nine new compressor stations that are proposed to be constructed as part of the Project. On June 1, 2015, Tennessee provided information to the FERC regarding these specific locations for the nine proposed compressor station locations, with a supplement to that filing submitted on June 4, 2015. Tennessee has identified you as a landowner whose property is located within one-half miles of a property where Tennessee is proposing to locate a new compressor station and is therefore providing you a copy of these filings submitted to the FERC with this letter.

Tennessee strives to be a good neighbor and appreciates your interest in this Project. The northeast region as a whole stands to benefit from the Project as it will enable the region to sustain its electric grid and lower energy costs to compete on a more level economic playing field with other regions of the nation with access to reliable, low-cost gas supplies. As part of Tennessee's fully integrated natural gas pipeline transportation system, the Project will provide additional access to diverse supplies of natural gas to expansion customers in the northeast region, including New England.
